Griffith Observatory is located in Los Angeles, sitting on the south-facing slope of Mount Hollywood in Los Angeles' Griffith Park. It commands a view of the Los Angeles Basin, including Downtown Los Angeles to the southeast, Hollywood to the south, and the Pacific Ocean to the southwest. The observatory is a popular tourist attraction with an extensive array of space and science-related displays.

Hollywood -Find most of the most famous Hollywood tourist attractions such as the hand/footprints in the cement courtyard of the Chinese Theatre, Madame Tussaud's his area also holds some of the most famous celebrity stars in the Hollywood Walk of Fame (stars inlaid on the sidewalk).
